About the Father's Business...

Another year has slipped through our fingers. As we ponder on this, can we each say we made the most of this year, and we accomplished all that God our Father called us to accomplish? **God is asking - have you been about the Father's business?**

The Word tells us to be about the Father's business. Just exactly what is the Father's business? Luke 2: 41 - 50 Jesus tells his parents:

Luke 2: 41 - 50 (NKJV)

41 His parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover. 42 And when He was twelve years old, they went up to Jerusalem according to the custom of the feast. 43 When they had finished the days, as they returned, the Boy Jesus lingered behind in Jerusalem. And Joseph and His mother did not know it; 44 but supposing Him to have been in the company, they went a day's journey and sought Him among their relatives and acquaintances. 45 So when they did not find Him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking Him. 46 Now so it was that after three days they found Him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions. 47 And all who heard Him were astonished at His understanding and answers. 48 So when they saw Him, they were amazed; and His mother said to Him, "Son, why have You done this to us? Look, Your father and I have sought You anxiously." 49 And He said to them, "Why did you seek Me? Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business?" 50 But they did not understand the statement which He spoke to them.

The Body of Christ is just like Joseph and Mary (But they did not understand the statement which He spoke to them.) The Body of True Believers do not comprehend that being a disciple of Jesus means we need to be about the business of fulfilling all that the Word speaks. Jesus was an example of being about the Father's business.

If we are about the Father's business, then we will suffer.

1 Peter 2: 21 - 23 (NKJV)

21 For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps: 22 "Who committed no sin, Nor was deceit found in His mouth"; 23 who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered,

He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously;

Paul tells us: 2 Timothy 3: 12 (NKJV) Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution.

Isaiah speaks this about Jesus:

Isaiah 53: 3 (NKJV) He is despised and rejected by men, A Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not esteem Him.

If we are about the Father's business, God will protect us. God always strengthens us to do His will.

1 Corinthians 10:13 (NKJV) 13 No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it.

Paul prayed this prayer over the people:

Colossians 1: 10 - 12 (NKJV) 10 that you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; 11 strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with joy; 12 giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers

of the inheritance of the saints in the light.

According to Romans 8: 28 - 30 (NKJV)

28 And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose. 29 For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. 30 Moreover whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified. And abundantly supplies for every good work

Submission to God By Rev. Brett Connell

True, effective and lasting change can take place when a person understands what it means to submit to God and resist the devil. This is something we continually learn in our lives, as we face challenges. The very things that God allows in our lives, or even asks us to do for Him, serve as opportunities for growth and change. We are continually being transformed and renewed, with the expectation that lasting change should be a part of our spiritual walk.

[James 4: 7] So submit to [the authority of] God. Resist the devil [stand firm against him] and he will flee from you. (AMP)

James teaches us to submit to God's authority as a primary action before resisting the devil. Why? Because if we aren't totally submitted to God, then the devil has a legal right to enter into us. This is one possible reason why prayers are not answered, why blessings seem to only trickle into our lives, or why sickness might prevail in our bodies. It is not God's fault for why the enemy has rights to oppress us, if we are not submitted to God. It is our fault for not submitting to God, first. What was James talking about before he made this statement?

[James 4: 1 - 4a] 1 Do you know where your fights and arguments come from? They come from the selfish desires that make war inside you. 2 You want things, but you don't get them. So you kill and are jealous of others. But you still cannot get what you want. So you argue and fight. You don't get what you want because you don't ask God. 3 Or when you ask, you don't receive anything, because the reason you ask is wrong. You only want to use it for your own pleasure. 4 You people are not faithful to God! ... (ERV)

This is speaking of the inner mindsets we have. How we think, what we desire, our expectations of God and others, our motivation and intentions, even what we believe and seek for. These are the very things that stir up problems when they are not submitted to God. These are also the very same things that the devil looks for to invade the broken walls of our hedge and work through our flesh.

What we must do is re-evaluate our mindsets, our hearts, and if necessary, even cry out to God continually for the lasting change to occur deep within our hearts. At times, we are our own worst enemy – but God is greater. With true repentance, and willful actions, we can be transformed into the mindset and heart of total submission to God.



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Janucá 2021

Janucá comienza en la noche del 25 del mes hebreo de Kislev y dura ocho días. La palabra Janucá es de origen hebreo dedicatoria. Hanukkah también se llama el Festival de las Luces. El comienzo de esta fiesta varía año a año en el calendario occidental, aunque generalmente ocurre a fines de noviembre y finales de diciembre.

El Festival de la Dedicación se estableció como una conmemoración

de la purificación del Templo en Jerusalén; la eliminación del altar antiguo y contaminado; y la restauración de la adoración del Señor.

Cuando los Macabeos comenzaron a preparar el templo para la re-dedicación, descubrieron que tenían aceite para encenderlo por una noche.

El aceite duró ocho días. Las velas se encienden todas las noches de Janucá para conmemorar el milagro. Durante la primera noche, se enciende una vela en una lámpara de araña especial llamada menorá. Al comienzo de la segunda noche, se agrega una vela hasta que llegue a las ocho en punto de la última noche.

Las velas se encienden mediante una vela separada llamada Shamash, que se enciende primero y luego se usa para encender las otras velas. Las velas se instalan en la menorá de derecha a izquierda, pero se encienden de izquierda a derecha. El dreidel, una pirinola con la que se hace un juego. Las comidas tradicionales de Janucá, como los latkes o los bollos de patata, se frien en aceite.

Juan 10:22-42 En estos días se celebraba en Jerusalén la fiesta de la Dedicación. Era invierno, 23 y Jesús entró en el templo, a través del pórtico de Salomón. 24 y los judíos lo rodearon y le preguntaron: "¿Cuánto tiempo nos vas a tener en suspenso? Si tú eres el Cristo, cuéntanos, francamente. 25 ya te lo he dicho, y no lo creo. Las obras que hago en nombre de mi Padre son las que me acreditan, 26 pero no crees porque no eres de mi rebaño. 27 mis ovejas oyen mi voz: Yo las conozco, y ellas me siguen. 28 les doy vida eterna, y nunca perecerán, y nadie los quitará de mi mano. 29 mi Padre, que me los ha dado, es más grande que todos; de la mano del Padre ningún hombre puede quitárselos.

30 el Padre y yo somos uno. 31 de nuevo los judíos tomaron piedras para arrojarles, 32 pero Jesús les dijo: "Les he mostrado muchas obras irreprochables que vienen del Padre. 33 No te apedreamos por ninguno de ellos, sino por blasfemia: porque tú, siendo hombre, te haces pasar por Dios. 34 ¿Y respondió Jesús: "No está escrito en su ley: "He dicho que vosotros ser dioses"? 35 Si Dios llamó a aquellos por quienes vino la palabra (y la Escritura no puede ser quebrantada), 36 ¿Por qué acusan de blasfemia a quienes el Padre apartó para sí mismo y envió al mundo? 37 si no hago las obras de mi Padre, no me creas.

38 pero si las hago, aunque no me crean, crean en mis obras, para que sepan y entiendan que el Padre está en mí, y que yo estoy en el Padre. 39 de nuevo intentaron detenerlo, pero se le fue de las manos. 40 Jesús regresó al otro lado del Jordán, al lugar donde Juan había estado bautizando antes; y allí permaneció. 41 muchas personas vinieron a él y le dijeron: "Aunque Juan nunca hizo ninguna señal milagrosa, todo lo que dijo acerca de este hombre fue verdadero". 42 y muchos en ese lugar creyeron en Jesús.

Bah! Humbug!

Yes, I said it. Bah! Humbug! There will be people in your life who feel this way. Not everyone has the ability to fully release themselves into the Christmas season. Life happens and when it does people need to be allowed to be real. We have so many fake people in the Church. They plaster on a face and pretend that everything is wonderful. But in reality, they are falling apart and just moments away from an emotional collapse. We don't like to admit this in Church. We teach people that you have to have it all together all the time. This is a lie. You are a real person with real emotions that come from God. And sometimes those emotions need to be expressed.

There will be times when your emotions are out of sync with the seasons that God brings to your life. This does not make you less of a child of God. This makes you the person that God created you to be. We have been processing a lot of bad things. Some things we knew were coming, some things we had no idea were out there and they knocked us down. You cannot pretend that the knock down did not occur. It did. You got knocked down. You need to process this through your emotions and move on. There will be times in your life where you will have to say Bah! Humbug! It's okay to do this.

We need to give people the grace they need to move through the challenges of life. Perry Stone Jr, recently posted his testimony on Facebook on November 29, 2021. He said the following, "Emotional Healing... I have been in physical, emotional, and mental recovery now for over fifteen months. The Doctors and specialists who counsel said it would take about a year or longer for my nervous system and body to heal if I took care of myself. Then after getting hit with the flu and COVID, the fatigue took its toll for some time." This was a real-life experience that he had. This was a Bah! Humbug! Moment.

Some in the Body of Christ are dealing with similar situations. Instead of shunning them, we need to pray for them. The phrase "Bah! Humbug!" became famous through the character of Ebenezer Scrooge in Charles Dickens timeless classic, A Christmas Carol. The word "Bah!" is simply

WHEN in the Course of human Events, it becomes necessary for one People to dissolve the Political Bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the Powers of the Earth, a new and equal Station, in which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a more solemn Appeal to the Supreme Judge, than that of the King of Earths.

We hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are, Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness.—That to secure these Rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just Powers from the Consent of the Governed, that whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these Ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its Foundation on such Principles, and organizing its Powers in such Manner, as shall seem to them most likely to promote their Safety and Happiness.

Let's look at this from a different perspective. For some people the Christmas season encompasses a lot of heartache and heartbreak that can be extremely unbearable. They were already having a hard time with life, now everything has to be happy, happy, joy, joy. There is no outlet for these people to get relief. These people may be proclaiming internally "Bah! Humbug!" These are points of pain that some people do not know how to cope with or move through. Many people are working through grief due to the loss of a loved one, they may be going through a divorce, they may be experiencing a physical illness, or suffering from some type of financial hardship. This is real pain. And sometimes this pain does not just disappear. It can linger in some people's lives for an extended period of time.



Sit in this for a moment. Really take some time to think this through. Have you poo poed someone's pain? Have you brushed over that pain and not ministered to them as Jesus would minister to them? Life is real. We need to be real with people and help them through their pain. This one needs help and needs to be healed. No matter what the emotional difficulty we should find it in

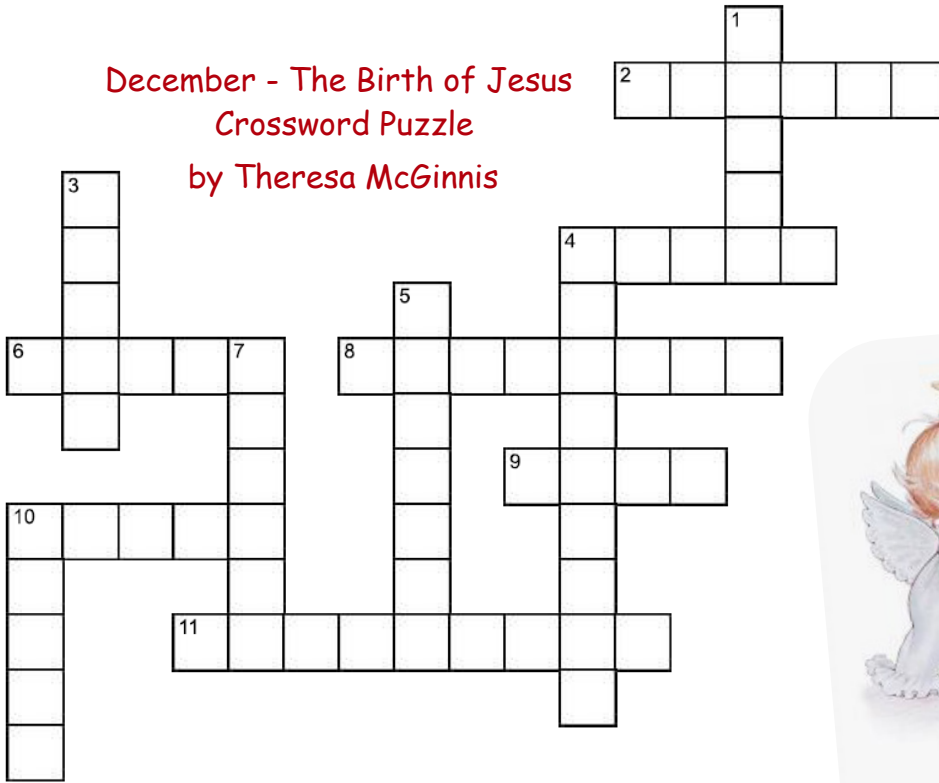
our hearts to minister to their point of pain. We as the body of Christ must acknowledge that many people right now are hurting and they have no idea when this is going to stop. You're going to encounter those who have dealt with severe traumas and extreme difficulties throughout their lives. They look strong but they are just one push away from going over the cliff. We have an opportunity to take the truth of the gospel to them. We can take these opportunities and bring them up into God's stature and ways. God has said He wants us to rejoice in this season.

With this understanding we must take into consideration those who find it difficult to rejoice. We must not look down upon them. We must try to understand where they're at and meet them to help bring them up out of the pit that they have found themselves in. If you've never been through the valley or suffered a deep emotional loss it is important for you not to trample on these ones that have. It's easy to say I'm praying for you in a flip-pant tone not considering all that they have been through.

No, God doesn't want them to stay there. He doesn't want you to reject them. He wants us to learn how to minister to them in such a way that it will break down and destroy that "Bah! Humbug!" that is in their spirit man. This will give them the desire that they need to cry out to God and to begin that relationship with Him that He desires for them to have. We must allow the Holy Spirit to minister to those who are walking through depression and anxiety. There will be times where it will take deliverance; there will be times where it will take a deep anointing from an altar call; and there will be times where all it will take is a simple act of kindness like a kind embrace. This embrace will destroy everything the enemy has set up in a person's life.

We have to use wisdom. We need to know when to apply the tools that God has given to us. Failure to comprehend the proper time and season may cause someone to stumble and even lose out on their freedom with God. God is teaching us by the Spirit. If you know someone with a "Bah! Humbug" in their Spirit ask the Lord to help you understand them. You just might be the key to bringing them out of the pain that they are going through. Selah.
